

NCEA Corner

All students sitting the NCEA external examinations should also now have received a copy of the NCEA Candidate Information Sheet 2024 and their Examination Admission Slip. Students should read the NCEA Candidate Information Sheet 2024 carefully so they are aware of the NCEA examination rules and expectations. Students must also check their Admission Slip shows all of the external examinations they should be entered for. If there are errors or omissions, please contact Mr Mike Cole, Principal's Nominee urgently on MCE@camhigh.school.nz.

The NCEA external examinations start on **Tuesday 5 November**. Morning examinations run from 9.30am to 12.30pm and afternoon examinations run from 2.00pm to 5.00pm. Examination room information will be displayed on the whiteboard at the outside the Admin Block on the morning of the examination. It is important students are outside the Admin Block by no later than 9.00am for a morning session and 1.30pm for an afternoon session in order to receive the examination instructions. To be allowed entry into the examination room, students must:

- 1. Be in full school uniform. No school jackets, hats or watches (of any type) are allowed in the examination room. All water bottles must be clear plastic with no writing on them;
- 2. Have photo ID; and
- 3. Their NCEA Examinations Admission Slip

If students do not have photo ID or their NCEA Examinations Admission Slip on the morning of the examination, they must go urgently to the Student Office for assistance.


Students will be allowed to take an emergency pack of items into the examination room, that must remain underneath their chairs for the duration of the examination. This emergency pack can contain keys, cell phone (switched off) and other small emergency items. The emergency pack must be a small clear plastic bag. All other bags will be left outside the examination room.

Students with Special Assessment Conditions (SACs) meet their supervisor at Whare Tautoko and the supervisor will take you to the examination room.

If a student is unable to attend their examination or their performance in an examination is significantly impaired, they should immediately contact Mr Mike Cole on MCE@camhigh.school.nz as it may be possible to apply for a derived grade. Derived grades are available to candidates who suffer from an illness, trauma or misadventure leading up to/at the time of their external examinations. There are strict criteria that must be met for an application to be accepted by NZQA and the deadline for submission of derived grade applications is 5pm on Thursday 5 December 2024.

SPECIAL REPORT: Navigating AI Relationships

Despite governments globally moving towards raising the minimum age for social media access due to mounting concerns about the negative effects on youth mental health and wellbeing, there's now an even newer challenge on the horizon - the rise of romantic and companion AI bots. Criminologists warn that children as young as 12 are accessing dating apps, often bypassing age restrictions, exposing them to sexual content and predatory behaviour. Researchers have also found that many adolescents are turning to virtual partners for validation, risking unhealthy emotional attachments that can affect real-life relationships.

As AI reshapes social dynamics, it's crucial to stay informed and engaged. While AI can enhance education and creativity, it also presents challenges around privacy, mental health, and misinformation.


