PROGRAM AT A GLANCE

The UCI Oceania Continental Satellite Centre in conjunction with Cycling New Zealand want to invite students that have never thought of cycling as a sport to our Ride to Glory talent day. Designed to introduce cycling to our Pacifica community, it will provide young adults with a clear, dedicated pathway to representing their nation in the sport of cycling.

The UCI World Cycling Oceania Continental Satellite here in Cambridge New Zealand intends to break down entry barriers into the sport of competitive cycling, while putting National Championships, Oceania Championships, and real chance at World and Olympic representation within clear view.

TRACK CYCLING

Track cycling is one of the most exciting Olympic sports, where riders compete head-to-head in a battle of speed, power, and strategy. Track cycling is raced on a velodrome, a specialized track designed for high-speed racing. Track cycling has something for everyone, where racing is contested over several different distances, and riders aim to outpace and outsmart their opponents.

TRACK ENDURANCE

Events range from 4km to 40km. The majority are mass start events where individuals use power, speed, endurance, strategy and tactics to compete for glory.

TRACK SPRINTING

This is the fastest human powered Olympic sport, with riders reaching speeds close to 80kmh. Riders can compete in 4 different events, with durations ranging from 10 seconds to 1-minute.



NEXT STEPS

Join us for an exciting day where you will have the opportunity to showcase your talent in an action-packed environment at no cost, just a little sweat and hard work. The day will feature power, speed and aerobic testing. You'll be able to try out our World Class velodrome, get some tips on the BMX pump track, take a spin on the mountain bike trail, and meet some of our Olympic Medalists from Paris.

The Ride to Glory talent day will help identify top athletes who have a real chance to progress into the next phase of development. All the necessary track and gym access, elite coaching and equipment will be provided to help build you into the next Track cycling athlete.

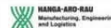
